
## VENUE AND MEETING DATES

## HOST CITY: BUENOS AIRES

Buenos Aires is the capital and largest city of Argentina. It is a top tourist destination: the most visited city in South America, and the second-most visited city in Latin America.

Strongly influenced by European culture, Buenos Aires is sometimes called the "Paris of the South" or "Paris of South America".

## ART AND CULTURE

Buenos Aires has a huge range of museums offering major collections of international and Latin American art and insights into Argentina's history and culture. The city also boasts exciting cultural centres that host all kinds of performances and exhibitions, many of them with free entry.

The city's art museums include the **National Museum of Fine Arts** (Museo Nacional de Bellas Artes - MNBA), which boasts one of the best art collections in Latin America with pieces by Picasso, Goya, El Greco, Rembrandt and many more. The **Museum of Latin American Art** (MALBA) features outstanding pieces of 20th century Latin American art, including work by Frida Kahlo and Diego Rivera, while the **Museum of Modern Art** (Museo de Arte Moderno) has important international and national pieces, including work by Salvador Dalí, Pablo Picasso, Joan Miró and Henri Matisse.

Elsewhere, you can get an insight into the life and work of Argentina's most famous first lady at the [Museo Evita](#), and discover a host of other museums covering everything from science to weaponry.

Buenos Aires has around 300 theatres, making it one of the best cities in the world for performing arts. Head along Av. Corrientes between Av. Callao and Av. 9 de Julio and you will find yourself in BA's very own Broadway. The city's theatres show everything from musicals to ballet, comedy to circus.

Most famous, of course, is the majestic [Teatro Colón](#) (Cerrito 618, San Nicolás). Often referred to [in the same breath](#) as London's Royal Opera House and Milan's La Scala, the Colón Theatre is a world-class venue for opera, ballet and classical music. With unparalleled acoustics and a gorgeous décor, it's worth a peek inside even if you haven't time for a show or a guided tour. Other standout theatres include:

[Teatro Nacional de Cervantes](#) (Av. Córdoba 1155, San Nicolás). Considered the main national stage theatre in Buenos Aires, the Teatro Nacional has three performance stages. Many comedy acts perform here too.

[Teatro San Martín](#) (Av. Corrientes 1530, Montserrat). The prestigious San Martín is part of the [Centro Cultural General San Martín](#).

## ARCHITECTURE

Passing through the streets of Buenos Aires, you'll be struck by the rich and eclectic mix of architectural styles on display. Private homes, small businesses

and even car parks can reveal details that delight and intrigue, and that's before we even mention the grand palaces, public buildings, and landscaped parks. The city's wealth at the start of the 20th century, together with a boom in immigration from Europe, brought architects from Italy, Britain, France and Germany to add their contributions to the city's collage of styles. ## THE LOCAL CURRENCY

Argentina's national currency is the Argentine peso. Note that it has the same symbol (\$) as the US dollar (don't be confused - prices expressed using the \$ symbol are in Argentine pesos unless stated otherwise. US dollars are usually referred to using the symbol: U\$S).

## CHANGING MONEY

It is easy to exchange money in Buenos Aires at casas de cambio (bureaux de change/currency exchanges) and at most banks - note that you will need to provide identification.

Illegal money changers operating in the street, particularly in areas such as Calle Florida, may claim to offer a slightly better rate for dollars and euros than banks and casas de cambio, but for safety reasons it is advised to change money at regulated institutions. For the same reason, we do not advise changing large amounts of money at one time.

Local currency can also be withdrawn 24 hours a day from ATMs, and larger shops and restaurants usually accept payment by credit or debit card.

## CREDIT CARDS

Credit cards are used widely in big shops in Argentina; VISA, American Express, and Master Card are accepted at major hotels and most restaurants and retail outlets.

## TIPPING

Tips commonly average 10% of the total bill in Argentina, in the Local Argentina

Peso or UD dollars (no credit card) , but can vary depending on the quality of the service provided.

## TAX-FREE SHOPPING

Foreign tourists are eligible to reclaim value added tax (VAT) on purchases of domestically-manufactured goods with a value over ARS 70 when acquired at participating outlets. ## TRANSPORTATION

Buenos Aires has a quick, efficient and economical public transport system with more than 180 bus lines linking every area of the city and six underground metro (subte) lines, which connect the city's historic political and financial centre with the main avenues, train stations and coach stations.

To travel on public transport, you'll need a SUBE travelcard, which you can get from one of our Tourist Assistance Centers, subte stations and many kiosks throughout the city. Simply charge the card with credit and you're ready to travel. To check the best itinerary, download the free app Cómo Llego for your smartphone.

Another good way to get around BA is by bicycle. The city has one of the world's biggest networks of cycle lanes and a free 24-hour public bikeshare scheme called EcoBici.

## ELECTRICITY

The voltage in Argentina is 220V, 50Hz. The power plugs used in Buenos Aires are of the three-pin, or two round-shaped type.

## WEATHER AND CLIMATE

In Buenos Aires, the month of June is characterized by temperatures from 8°C (46.4°F) to 5°C (59°F).

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Buenos Aires is located in the Argentina Standard Time zone:  
UTC/GMT-3 hours.
